Call to Order: Josie Middleton called the meeting to order at 8:30. There was no December meeting minutes.

Committee Reports

Annual Show: Brian Wetzig reported that the theme of the 2010 show will be petrified wood. Members should be thinking about display cases and ways to contribute. Les Postlethwait will be the show chairman. Brian said the 1,772 volunteer hours reported by members for the 2009 show were fewer than last year. It's not too late to report your hours.

Robert Folsom turned over a \$_____ check from this year's show. Robert resigned as show treasurer after many years of service; Frederick Falk will be the new treasurer.

Building: Josie reminded that the filters should be changed.

Mineral Display Cases: Josie said the cases in the clubhouse are for use by members to display their collections either temporarily or long-term.

Education/Classes: E-mail Joyce Hrapsky if you are interested in an upcoming class. Two new classes are: bead-making taught by Betsy Gager and doublets by Robert Morriss.

Federation: Paul Good sent word that the AFMS show will be in California and that the web site is up for reservations. Linda Northcote plans to attend.

Board Meeting Minutes

The January Board meeting was held on January 5, 2010. Below is a listing of the highlights of this meeting. A complete set of minutes is available upon request.

Treasurer's Report: Pauline bought Quicken software for \$40 and checks that will print with Quicken.

Old Business:

Faceting Inventory – Craig Brandt reported that the club has over 50 laps that they have now graded and valued at a total of \$ _____. He suggested charging \$3 per dop even though the various sizes range above & below \$3 in cost.

Estimated cost for faceting room needs: \$700 if IGI machine repair is included, \$600 if not. Note: The 2009 budget still has \$500 for workshop equipment. A motion passed to bring the \$500 from the 2009 workshop equipment budget forward to 2010 and permit Craig to purchase faceting equipment not to exceed \$1,000.

It will take about a month to order and get prepared for classes. Twenty people have expressed interest in a faceting class.

Trailers for AGMS – Robert Morriss and Louis Lee purchased 2 new 6' x 12' trailers. They hold a ton each, have metal skins, ramp-style doors, 3/4" plywood floors, fold down stabilizers, ventilators in the roofs, 15" wheels and interior lights. The side doors have keys and a bar that can be padlocked.

A motion passed to allow Robert to purchase 2 receiver hitch anti-theft devices and 6 locks for the new trailers at a cost of approximately \$90.

Richard Dorsey will look into liability insurance for trailers and report at the next meeting.

Electrical: Outside and Exit Lights – Gef Fisher and Robert Morriss will get the materials out and get with Glenn Gilbreath to decide when to do the projects.

Key Committee Update – Tabled because the key work depends on the exit signs.

Board Member Ron Carman Replaced – Stretch Young was introduced as Ron's replacement.

New Business

Beading Class - Betsy Gager presented a syllabus for a beading class in which she teaches knotting in between each bead (not seed beading). A motion passed approving her to teach the class which will meet for six weeks (one 2-3 hour session per week). Cost: \$20 plus materials

Nominating Committee - It was reported that Tom Bowers would volunteer for the nominating committee and is willing to canvas the membership for candidates for expiring terms. Charlotte Morriss is also willing to serve. Per the bylaws, the committee will consist of two long-term and two newer members. Need suggestions for two newer members.

Sam's Club Card – A motion passed that we not buy a Sam's Club or Costco card in the name of the club, but that we authorize the use of a tax-exempt form for purchases made for the club.

Advertising and Selling of Booths for Swap Meet – Kathleen Howard proposed flyers for distribution by the members and Craig's List (no paid advertising this year) and see how it goes. Stretch Young said we are allowed only two tax-exempt fund raising events per year. Last year did not have a good turnout because of a bad weather prediction.

Doublets Class – Robert Morriss presented his syllabus for a doublets class at the December board meeting. A motion passed to allow him to teach a class as presented in December and charge \$5. Robert clarified that it will be a one-night demonstration workshop lasting about 3 hours.

AGMS Member Survey – Robert Morriss brought an AGMS Member Survey for the January meeting. Frederick Falk will include it in the January *Stone Chipper*. Members can fill out the *Stone Chipper* copy and mail or bring it to the club in January for a drawing to be held at the general meeting. Additional copies will be available at the door. Jackie Fisher will provide the drawing prize.

Insurance Problems – Pauline Denson reported that it took four months to get our policy from our insurance company in Tyler. (Reason for a Tyler insurer: we were getting part of it through the South Central Federation.) A motion passed to allow Pauline to seek a new local insurance representative for liability and property insurance.

Request from Ed Gage – Ed, the club historian, spent \$222 last year on the book he sent to the Federation. He requests an increase to \$300 this year. A motion passed to revisit the issue in approximately three months.

Stone Chipper Deadlines – Frederick Falk, the new *Stone Chipper* editor, asked to have all items by the Friday following the Thursday general meeting (the next day). An exception: general meeting minutes from the secretary may be submitted later when necessary.

Workshop Usage

If you are member in good standing (having paid your dues for the current year), you may use the equipment in the workshop *after* you have been certified to work on that machine. The club has invested a lot of money into these machines and equipment. For your safety and the safety of the equipment, we require all members to be checked out on the equipment prior to using it.

There are two ways in which you can be checked out to operate this equipment. First is to take a class that uses the equipment you wish to use. Once you have demonstrated proficiency with the equipment, you may use it when the workshop is open on Wednesdays. If you are already proficient on a particular piece of equipment, having taken a class from another organization, you may come up on a Wednesday when the workshop is open and get checked out by Gef Fisher. He has a checklist of operations that must be performed satisfactorily by you that demonstrates your proficiency with the equipment.

Once you have been cleared to use the equipment, you may use the equipment at a rate of \$2.00 an hour. If you have any questions regarding equipment usage or when the equipment is available, please contact Gef Fisher.
