CRYSTAL CLEANING TIP
from The Mineralogist, Aug. 1964

Many collectors use hydrochloric acid for cleaning the brown iron stains from quartz crystals. This cleans the crystals, but usually leaves a residue of ferric chloride which requires prolonged washing to remove. Tartaric acid, while slower, will clean as well, and its residue is easily rinsed away. Tartaric acid comes in crystal form. Place a spoonful, or so, of crystals in water and immerse the specimen. If action is very slow, add more crystals. Tartaric acid is stronger than oxalic acid, but milder than hydrochloric acid.

Show Pin: Susan received the design and sent it off but has not received a quote on the 2 sizes.

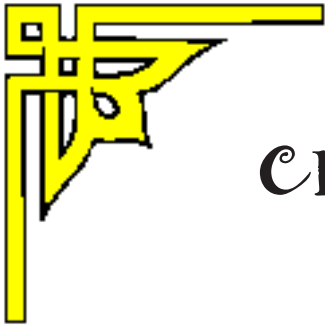
Show Bulletin: Diann brought a sample of what she has for the bulletin. It was discussed and a few changes were suggested.

SLAB SAW VICE TIP -

From Lapidary Journal, Dec. 1953, and another lapidary magazine of the era.

When the wood boards, attached to the jaws of your slab saw vice, need replacing, replace them with second growth hickory, instead of hard maple. The second growth hickory is much tougher than the hard maple wood. it will grip the stone, just as tight, and will last much longer.

Library: Harriett Strieber said that the library is being rearranged to make better use of space. She said that Roger Waguespack is now the media librarian, some more work days are needed, and volunteers are always welcome.

Elections: Robert Morriss said that at the next Board of Directors meeting the Board would be approving nominations for the Board and officers. He said volunteers are needed, especially newer members who have not been active in the day-to-day running of the club.

There were fifty-one members and five visitors present .

September 15, 2011

Minutes: Minutes for August were presented for review, and then submitted with corrections.

Treasurer: Brian provided information of the beginning and approximate ending balances.

Auction: Chip will send out an email to club members asking for donations. Chip will pickup some reject canvas bags in Belton for very little cost, and maybe sell them for \$1.00 to people so they can put their purchases in especially at the auction table.

Advertising: Pauline obtained the prices for both the Austin American-Statesman at \$495.00 a wk for ¼ page and the Chronicle at \$299.00 a wk for 1/8 page. We will do one week for both. Susan brought in the car magnets for show and will sign them out at the meeting. Susan worked out the yard signs and will be ordering them.

Dealer Signs: Need new signs for the new dealers. Robert advised they will be working on them.

Floor Plans: Robert presented floor plan with chairs across the middle and chairs on the other side of the gem mine. The chairs will not be put out until late Friday or early Saturday morning.

Grand Prize Forms: There are plenty for this years' show.

Move-in: There was some discussion on the move-in. Susan is to make a map of the lay-out of the trailers to place on the inside of the trailers.

School letters: Susan advised the school letters were sent out. Only four schools have registered so far.

Show Pin: Susan advised they are ordered and paid.

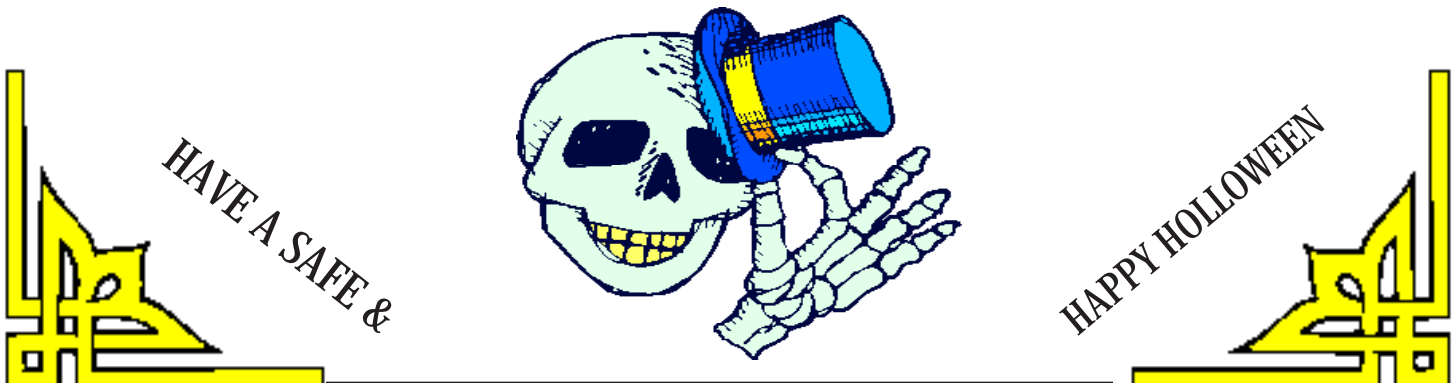

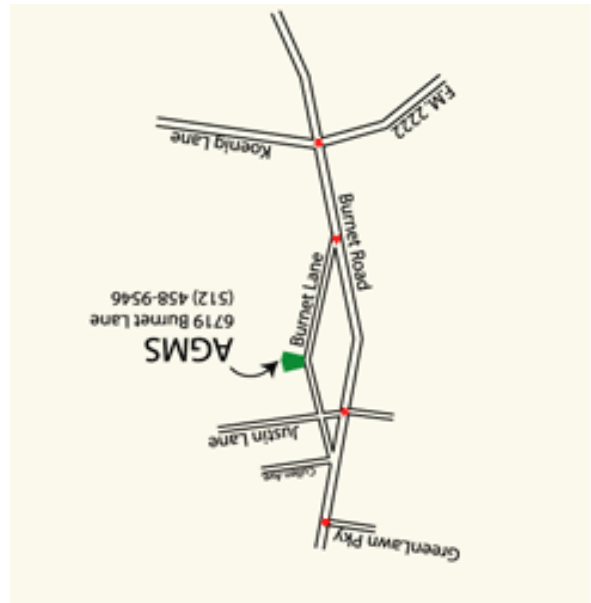
