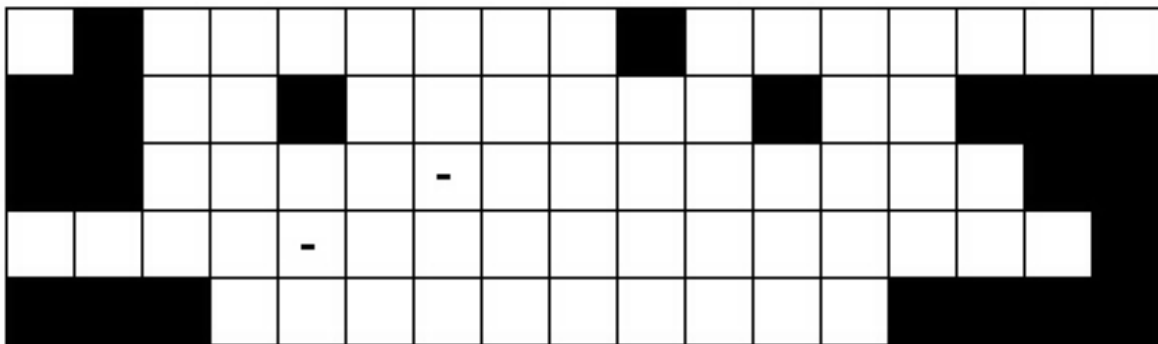

The Diamond is the April Gemstone. This issue of The Chippette is about Diamonds. Enjoy!

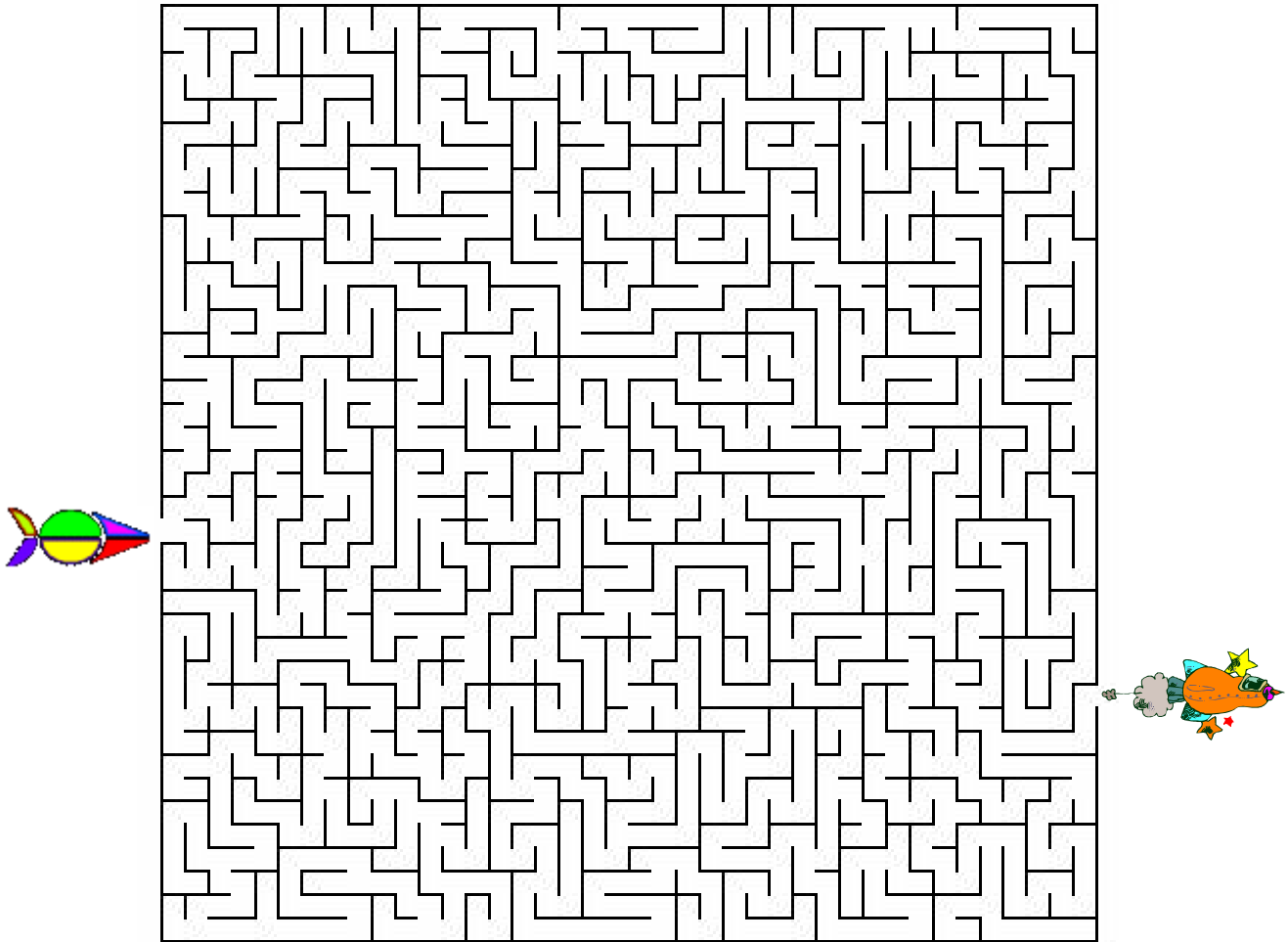

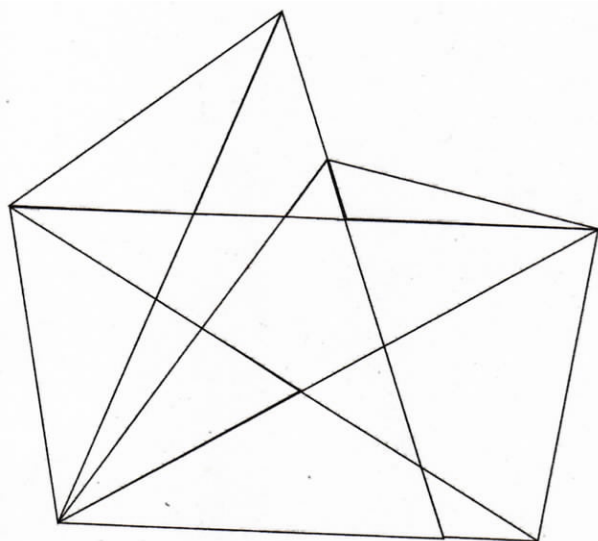

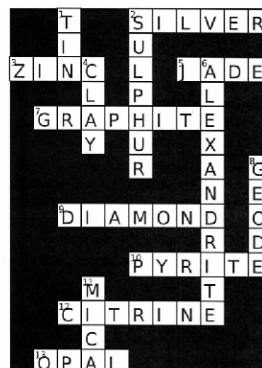
