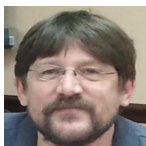

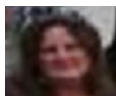

AGMS Board Meeting Minutes Synopsis

The AGMS Board met on June 7, 2011, to conduct club business. Below is a listing of the highlights of this meeting; a complete set of minutes is available upon request.

Attendees: Five officers, three board members and one general club member.

Treasurer's Report: Wing Evans reported the May ending balance. He also said the information for filing Form 990 had been delivered to the CPA.

Minutes: The May minutes were accepted as printed.

Old Business

Bylaws Revisions: No report.

Offer of Gift of Land - Discussion: Ron Carman, who offered to donate 20 acres of land near Terlingua to the club, brought two maps showing its Brewster County location and the tax valuation information. Ron bought the land in 1972 and does not have current knowledge of roads or access to the property. He said there is calcite on the property, but he does not know if there is agate.

Wing Evans suggested sending an emissary in November to visit, take photos and report. Robert Morriss tabled the issue until the October meeting.

New Business

Code "Keys" to the Building - Discussion: Robert Morriss asked if there was a need to set limits on the number of code "keys" issued. It was concluded that no changes were needed at this time.

Budget Expenses: Wing Evans alerted the Board that two budget items were over half or near half of the budgeted amounts. Hospitality and Utilities. It was suggested that members be encouraged to donate supplies. Recently, the air conditioner froze and after repairs, it required several days of running 24 hours a day to thaw it. Wing Evans said members who use the building should adjust the thermostat upon leaving to 80 degrees.

## Shop Talk

Did you know that the AGMS work room is open anytime the building is open, except during the monthly meeting? Please make sure that you have been tested out on any equipment prior to using. Using the the correct equipment for your project not only prevents costly equipment repairs and downtime, it might just prevent an unfortunate and serious injury to your person. When in doubt please ask the shop manger for assistance or guidance, and follow their instructions.

The following comes from From the Hounds Howl 2011

**TOOTHPICKS** – The round, stronger toothpicks have a multitude of uses on the jewelry bench. I use them for mixing epoxy resin, for applying paste solder, with Zam for polishing in tight spots, and with a bit of beeswax for picking up and positioning small stones. They're particularly good for testing the fit of a small faceted stone in a prong or tube set finding.

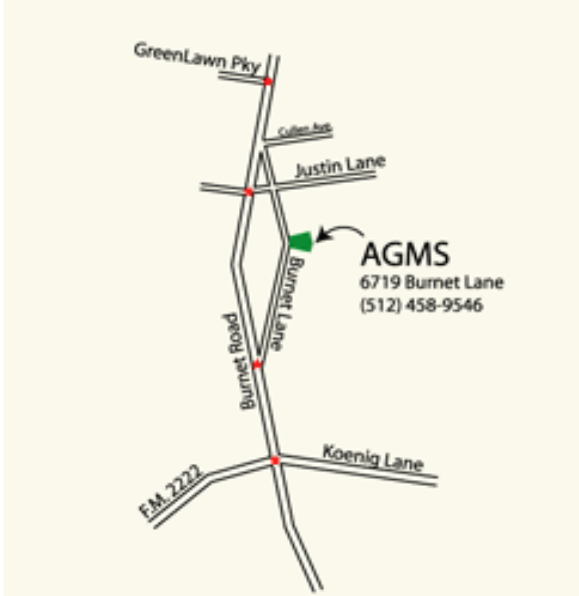
**PUMICE WHEELS** – Pumice wheels are good for touching up a bezel after you've set the stone. The hardness is about 6 on the Moh's scale, less hard than quartz, so it shouldn't scratch any of your jaspers. However, I'd avoid or be real careful of using pumice near the softer stones like turquoise, amber, howelite, etc. If you're unsure that a wheel is pumice, test it with a piece of glass. Glass is about 5 ½ on the Mohs scale.
